### How do I use Halsbury's Laws?

- Choose keywords that define the problem you wish to research and look them up in the **Consolidated** Index. All references lead you to a volume number (in bold) and a paragraph.
- Occasionally using the indexes may lead you to an incorrect paragraph number because the volume has been reissued since the **Index** or **Tables** were published. Where this occurs, check the reissued volume's own index or list of contents for the correct paragraph number.

### How do I update Halsbury's Laws?

- Note down the series, volume number and page reference of the paragraph you are updating. Look them up in the hardback **Cumulative Supplement** and then in the **Noter-Up** booklet. Volume numbers appear across the top of the page, page numbers down the side. Always check both supplement and noter-up, as there may be changes in both: one does not supersede the other.
- You might also check the index to the *Monthly Review* for summaries of relevant cases or legislation.
